We still searched for a "House of our own", and were eventually lucky to finch our present home in Lance Grove. Unfortunately, after eighteen years we nor have to move once again as the courts are required for housing. At this stage I moved like to thank the owners, Mr. and Mrs. Ween for their kinarsss and oorsiderstion during our tenancy.

They have been happy years at Lance Grove, and we are very sorry to leave. At the time of going ta press we are still seazining hopermily for new premises.

When we arrived at Lance Grove, we decided to join the Liverpool Tennis League, We entered a ladies and a gents team, but unfortunately the ladies team had to be withdrawn a few seasons ago. The gents team however has cortirued right up to this season. We have had varying degrees of success and re year we actually gained production. Several players have come and gore sincewe joined the League, but I would like to pay tributeito just oneJohn Burns. He was a mermen of the original team, and is still playing for us this season. No doubt if we are successful in finding new premises he will continue to play for us for many years to come. Nevertheless I think the time is opportune to say thankyou John and also to thank all those who have helped to keep the tennis section in being for the past 36 years.

Perhaps in the next issue we may have better news of somewhere to $u$. continue our activities. I hope so. Meanwhile good bye to Lance Grove and to all it's memories.

THE RULIS FLR TAKING A BEARING ARE VZRY SIMPIE, as simple as
One - Two - Three. To quote the SILVA system :-

1) Flace the compass on the map with one edge in line with your location and your destination, the arrow pointing in the direction you wish to travel.
2) Rotate the compass dial untill the grid lines on the compass are parallel to those on the map and the $\mathbb{N}$ on the dial points towards grir North.
3) Hold the compass level and slowly turn around untill the red end of the magnetic needle points to the North.
(N) and is parallel to the compass grid lines. YOUR DIRECTION OF TRAVEL IS AS SHOWN BY THE ARROW.
